1. Accounting policies

1.1. Accounting convention

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007).

1.2. Turnover

Turnover represents the total invoice value, excluding value added tax, of sales made during the year.

1.3. Goodwill

Acquired goodwill is written off in equal annual instalments over its estimated useful economic life of 5 years.

1.4. Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Land and buildings

Leasehold properties

Straight line over the life of the lease

Plant and machinery

20% Reducing balance

Fixtures, fittings

and equipment

33% Reducing balance

Motor vehicles

25% Reducing balance

The freehold property at Maidstone has not been depreciated as the directors believe that any future residual value will be equal at least to cost.

1.5. Leasing

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term.

1.6. Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at cost less provision for permanent diminution in value.

1.7. Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

1.8. Pensions

The company operates a money purchase pension scheme for its employees. If the employee makes contributions then the company will also make contributions. The pension costs shown in the accounts are those due for the year.

1.9. Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less or to receive more, tax, with the following exceptions:

Provision is made for tax on gains arising from the revaluation (and similar fair value adjustments) of fixed assets, and gains on disposal of fixed assets that have been rolled over into replacement assets, only to the extent that, at the balance sheet date, there is a binding agreement to dispose of the assets concerned. However, no provision is made where, on the basis of all available evidence at the balance sheet date, it is more likely than not that the taxable gain will be rolled over into replacement assets and charged to tax only where the replacement assets are sold;

Provision is made for deferred tax that would arise on remittance of the retained earnings of overseas subsidiaries, associates and joint ventures only to the extent that, at the balance sheet date, dividends have been accrued as receivable;

Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

1.10. Group accounts

The company is entitled to the exemption under Section 248 of the Companies Act 1985 from the obligation to prepare group accounts.

The company was owed £30,000 at the balance sheet date by Barclay Fencing Contractors Limited. The balance outstanding at the start of the period was £30,000. The rate of interest being charged is at 2% above base rate. Mr A Stewart-Clark holds 100% of the shares in Challenge Fencing Limited which in turn holds 75% of the shares in Barclay Fencing Contractors Limited. The maximum amount owed during the year was £30,000.

The company was owed £10,000 by Challenge Fencing Scotland Limited at the start of this year. The company has now ceased to trade and the loan of £10,000 has been written off in the profit and loss account.
