Accounting policies

B Basis of preparation

The financial statements are presented in Sterling, the functional currency of the Company

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with IFRS requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements about carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods. The most significant techniques for estimation are described in the accounting policies below

The accounting policies set out below have been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements

C Investments

Investments are carried in the statement of financial position at cost to the extent that the fair value cannot be reliably measured

D Priority profit share

Revenue comprises priority profit share from a Limited Partnership — To the extent that there are insufficient partnership profits to allocate the priority share of profit, an interest free loan is made to the Company which is included in Current Liabilities—As this loan is discharged out of surplus profits after future allocations, an amount equal to the shortfall is credited to the statement of comprehensive income and is included in Current Assets

E Operating expenses

Operating expenses consist of the management fee paid by the Company to its parent company

F Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognised on an accrual basis

G Other assets

Assets, other than those specifically accounted for under a separate policy, are stated at their cost less impairment losses. They are reviewed at each statement of financial position date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any such indication exists, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated based on expected discounted future cash flows. Any change in the level of impairment is recognised directly in profit or loss.

H Other liabilities

Liabilities, other than those specifically accounted for under a separate policy, are stated based on the amounts which we consider to be payable in respect of goods or services received up to the statement of financial position date

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Accounting policies

I Income taxes

Income taxes represent the sum of the tax currently payable, withholding taxes suffered and deferred tax. Tax is charged or credited in the statement of comprehensive income, except when it relates to items charged or credited directly to equity, in which case the tax is also dealt with in equity.

The tax currently payable is based on the taxable profit for the year. This may differ from the profit included in the statement of comprehensive income because it excludes items of income or expense that are taxable or deductible in other years and it further excludes items that are never taxable or deductible. The Company's liability for current tax is calculated using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the statement of financial position date.

Deferred tax is the tax expected to be payable or recoverable on differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities in the financial statements and the corresponding tax bases used in the computation of taxable profit ('temporary differences'), and is accounted for using the statement of financial position liability method

Deferred tax liabilities are generally recognised for all taxable temporary differences. Deferred tax assets are generally recognised to the extent that it is probable that taxable profits will be available against which deductible temporary differences can be utilised.

The carrying amount of deferred tax assets is reviewed at each statement of financial position date and reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that sufficient taxable profits will be available to allow all or part of the asset to be recovered

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not recognised if the temporary differences arise from the initial recognition of goodwill or other assets and liabilities in a transaction that affects neither the tax profit nor the accounting profit

Deferred tax is calculated at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the period when the liability is settled or the asset is realised using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the statement of financial position date

The fair value for the services provided to the Company by the Directors cannot be reliably estimated and as such no share-based payment charge has been allocated to the Company. A management fee to 3i plc, of £610,417 (2011 £565,518), has been made in respect of administration costs by a fellow subsidiary. The Directors of the Company are also directors of fellow subsidiaries and receive remuneration from 3i plc. The Directors do not believe that it is practicable to apportion this amount between their services as Directors of the Company and their services as directors of fellow subsidiary companies however the Directors' services to the Company do not occupy a significant amount

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Notes to the financial statements

11 Financial risk management

The Company is a subsidiary of 3i Group plc. The Group sets objectives, policies and processes for managing and monitoring risk as set out in the Directors' report in the 3i Group plc annual report. This note provides further information on the specific risks faced by the Company.

The capital structure of the Company consists of equity and intercompany loans which are due on demand. There is sufficent capital in the Company to cover liabilities and the Company is free to transfer capital to the parent company subject to maintaining sufficient reserves to meet statutory obligations. No significant constraints have been identified in the past and the Company have been able to distribute profits in a tax-efficient manner.

Credit risk

The Directors do not believe that there is significant credit risk as amounts owed by the Company's debtors are due from other Group companies and are payable on demand

Concentration risk

Concentration risk is managed at the Group level as discussed in the Directors' report in the 3i Group plc annual report. The Company is exposed to risk based on its sole investment in 3i Mayflower LP.

Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk is managed at the Group level as discussed in the Directors' report in the 3i Group plc annual report

The Company's liabilities are due on demand and there is no difference between the carry value of the liability and the contractual undiscounted cashflows due thereon

Market risk

The Directors do not believe that there is significant market risk as the Company does not hold fixed or floating rate loans or liabilities (other than intercompany loans), foreign currency assets or liabilities, or investments which are exposed to market fluctuations
