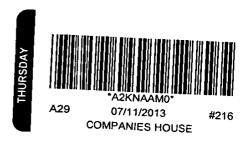

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

The trustees, who are directors for the purposes of company law, have pleasure in presenting their annual report for the purposes of the Charities Act 2011, together with the accounts for the year ended 31 March 2013. The trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005, in preparing the annual report and financial statements of the charity.

STRUCTURE GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Farnham Maltings Association Limited is a company limited by guarantee, governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. The company was incorporated on 22 May 1969. It was registered as a charity with the Charity Commission on 13 January 1970.

The charity is managed by a Council of Management which has not less than eight nor more than seventeen members Voting members are recommended by a selection panel and elected by the membership at an AGM. In accordance with the Articles of Association, voting members retire in rotation, with one-third retiring each year, and they are not available for re-election after a period of five years' service. Up to four non-voting members are appointed by the Council of Management from nominations by the main funders (Arts Council, Waverley Borough Council and Farnham Town Council). Arts Council do not wish to nominate a representative on Farnham Maltings Council of Management, but request copies of minutes and papers.

The current Trustees and those who have been appointed or retired during the year 2012/13 are as listed under Charity Information (page 1)

The Articles of Association provide for non-voting Members of Council who are not trustees of the charity – those who have been appointed to the Council in that capacity are as listed under Charity Information (page 1)

New trustees are given a briefing on their legal obligations under charity and company law, the content of the Memorandum and Articles of Association, the Council of Management and the decision making processes, the business plan and the financial position of the charity. On appointment they are given a chance to meet senior employees and other trustees. The Trustees and nominee members of the Council of Management hold a periodic 'away day' to discuss their role, and the aims and objectives of the organisation. Trustees are encouraged to study the range of governance guidance papers we have available

All trustees give of their time freely and no trustee remuneration was paid in the year. Details of trustee expenses and related party transactions are disclosed in note 10 to the accounts. Trustees are required to disclose all relevant interests and register them with the Chief Executive and in accordance with the charity's policy was withdraw from decisions where a conflict of interest arises.

The Council of Management administers the charity, and meets quarterly. There are sub-groups covering finance and resources. New sub-groups are formed as necessary to administer key projects such as capital development and fundraising. The Chief Executive is appointed by the Trustees to manage the day to day operations of the charity.

The Trustees of the Maltings have reviewed the risk management policy, and have initiated a risk management strategy which comprises

- An annual review of the risks the charity may face
- The establishment of systems and procedures to mitigate those risks identified in the plan
- The implementation of those procedures designed to minimise any potential impact on the charity should those risks materialise

This work has resulted in better emergency procedures and contingency plans, and has given the impetus for better planning for risks arising from fire, health and safety of artists and audiences, and food hygiene

Related parties

The charity has close working relationships with the Arts Council, Waverley Borough Council and Farnham Town Council who together provide substantial funding to enable the charity to carry out its charitable activities. Further information regarding transactions with related parties can be found in note 10 of these financial statements.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES FOR THE PUBLIC BENEFIT

Objectives

In shaping our objectives for the year and planning our activities, the trustees have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit, including the guidance on public benefit and fee charging. Farnham Maltings relies on grants and the income from fees and charges to cover its operating costs. In setting the level of fees, charges and concessions, the trustees give careful consideration to the accessibility of its activities for those on low incomes.

The objectives of Farnham Maltings Association as stated in the 1969 Memorandum of Association are

- a To establish community centres for the benefit of the inhabitants of the Town of Farnham aforesaid and the neighbourhood, without distinction of sex or political, religious or other opinions, for the advancement of education and the provision of facilities, in the interests of social welfare, for recreation and leisure-time occupation, with the object of improving the conditions of life for the said inhabitants
- b To promote and encourage the arts among the said inhabitants, including the musical, visual, dramatic, cinematic and applied arts
- c Generally, to encourage, promote, undertake or carry on or assist the promotion, undertaking or carrying on of such charitable activities and purposes as may strengthen the bonds of community life of the inhabitants aforesaid or otherwise be beneficial to the community within the Town of Farnham and neighbourhood aforesaid

Farnham Maltings is a creative organisation that works with artists to enrich the quality of life of the towns and villages of South East England. During the past year we have organised our work around a series of strategies in pursuit of our ambition to ensure that Farnham remains a happy, safe and creative community capable of supporting an organisation that enriches the cultural offer for the region. These strategies are

- · Investing resources and expertise in new theatre,
- Supporting artists with bespoke business advice,
- · Increasing participation in the arts,
- · Developing the marketplace for art,
- Supporting the range of community users of the buildings,
- Ensuring Farnham Maltings is well resourced and championed by entering into partnerships locally, nationally and internationally

Activities at the Maltings

Over the past year we have consolidated the Maltings as one that provides cultural services across the town and borough particularly since taking on additional responsibility for the management of the museum of Farnham. At the Maltings we are increasingly focusing our energies on developing an informal programme of festivals and events many of which attract a national and sometimes international audience. The digital programme continues to grow, partly on the back of a hugely revived digital film programme and, pleasingly, we are growing a theatre programme.

We offer a range of community organisations a subsidised user's rate and work at continued improvement in the quality and range of services offered from the Maltings. Our view is that be improving the perceived quality we will safeguard the long term future of these buildings.

After 7 years we have relinquished the Old Fire Station in Godalming as a set of artists' studios as the County looks to sell the asset but we continue to support Cranleigh Arts Centre in pursuance of their ambitions

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The Farnham Maltings continues to build a reputation for delivering services locally, regionally and nationally. We have invested in creating a confident, stable and skilled staff team who share a vision of the Maltings that works to support others in achieving their ambitions. We continue to think about our value to the town and how we might work with others to strengthen a regional ecology that will benefit us all. We have rebuilt the organisational structure so that we can adapt and grow with the opportunities and worry less about surviving and more about increasing the quality, range and impact of our work. All three of our primary funders have demonstrated a belief in our work and capabilities that has further encouraged us to think ambitiously. So that now we are the recipients of major funding from Esmee Fairbairn and co-ordinate the activities of the Arts Partnership for Surrey.

What follows is a summary of the activities and achievements of Farnham Maltings over the past year. It has been a good year for the Maltings. Despite, or perhaps because of, the challenging operating environment we have developed a range of new services, found new ways of achieving our ambitions and sustained our core.

In that past year we have taken on the management of the Museum of Farnham, established house as a model of shared ambition for programmers across the region, begun to co-ordinate the Arts Partnership for Surrey and evolved caravan from a biennial showcase into a year round initiative that supports the international ambitions of the independent theatre sector. All of which presents a challenge when communicating, meaningfully, what ties the range of work the Maltings delivers. That said our purpose remains accurately described as 'to encourage the most people to see, make and enjoy the best art they can.' This is a fairly inadequate attempt to list these outputs by theme and by activity. So we have grouped these outputs into four key strands - loosely based on the priorities of Surrey CC and Waverley BC- and against areas of the business – caravan, house, craft etc.

artist development theatre

- · Mounted national tour of new piece for village halls In Praise of Elephants
- Little Bulb tour nationally with Operation Greenfield & Goose Party and are commissioned to make Christmas show for Bristol Old Vic in 2013
- Little Bulb and Camille Boitel collaborate to make Calamity Cabaret premiered at Marseille as part of their City of Culture celebrations funded through the PASS interreg programme
- Brokered relationship for Little Bulb with the National to make Squally Showers for summer 2013
- Victoria Melody and Little Bulb are selected as part of the East to Edinburgh programme which allows them to apply respectively for £13k and £17k to the eastern region to support their Edinburgh runs
- Supported 26 new and emerging theatre and dance companies via 1 1's, performance feedback, Grants for arts advice and training, providing networking opportunities
- Set up a regular theatre e-newsletter that reaches over 500 industry peers and colleagues each edition
- · Established house as a regional programming model for East and South East England
- In the first year 105 venues and 240 companies and artists have registered for house. Of the venues, 65 are based in the South East region, and 40 in the East
- The season averaged 62% capacity across all of the performances, reaching a total of 3892 audience members

- · Initiated a new festival, thread, as a national festival of textiles in November 2013
- Developed Craft Connects project with Ministry of Defence for work across Rushmoor with the Nepalese community

- Awarded a £15,000 commission to 2 artists for a craft installation to mark the Queen's Jubilee
- · Increased visitor attendance at festival of crafts by 20% over two days

FINANCIAL REVIEW

In 2005 the Trustees set up their Finance and Resources Group to monitor and review the charity's finances. The committee meets quarterly to make ongoing recommendations to the Council of Management.

Reserves Policy

The level of free reserves, which under Charity Commission criteria exclude restricted funds and amounts represented by fixed assets, was a deficit of £49,971 as at the year end. Within its fixed assets, however, the charity holds the cottage, valued at £240,000, which is not used for operational purposes by the charity and can be used as security for borrowing. This is therefore regarded by the Council of Management as part of the available reserves, leaving a residual reserves surplus of £190,029.

The Council of Management consider that the desired level of residual reserves is currently £150,000, being £50,000 to cover the loss of a major funder for one year and £100,000 to cover retention of key staff and alternative accommodation for six months if the Maltings is required to close because of fire or other major occurrence. The Council recognise that some causes of closure may be covered by insurance but nevertheless regard this as a prudent reserves level.

Fixed assets

In the opinion of the Trustees, the market value of the freehold property owned by the company is considerably in excess of the book value

Principal Funding Sources

The principle funding of Farnham Maltings operations is sourced 60% from income arising from facilities hire, promoted events, and Maltings events, and 40% from Arts Council England, Waverley Borough Council and Farnham Town Council

Detailed figures are given in note 3 to the accounts at the rear of the Annual Report

Future Plans

We will continue to work at exceeding the expectations placed on us by our two main funders, retain our audiences' affection and surprise ourselves with new collaborators – such as the recent one with the British Army in Aldershot The museum is an initial three-year project and it is clear that it will take us all of that time to put in place a more robust, ambitious structure that might better serve the needs of the town. House has quickly demonstrated the value in developing shared ambition and we need to use the social capital and leadership role this has put us in to make the most of those relationships.

Similarly caravan 2014 places us at the forefront of a discussion about how artists raise improve the quality and reach of their work. We intend to grow the training programme for both house and caravan

We will continue to work with others – through co-productions and commissions. But, importantly, we intend to make two of our own shows in 2013. We have outlined below much of the detail of our activity plans for 2013/14 which remain the same as those described in our funding agreement.

We will set ambitions within our business plan against a consistent set of targets that include Showcase and marketplaces, programming new work, Producing and commissioning and nurturing artists and makers

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities issued in March 2005, applicable UK Accounting Standards and the Companies Act 2006

Incoming Resources

Voluntary income including donations, gifts and legacies and grants that provide core funding or are of a general nature are recognised where there is entitlement, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability. Such income is only deferred when

- a) The donor specifies that the grant or donation must only be used in future accounting periods or
- b) The donor has imposed conditions which must be met before the charity has unconditional entitlement

Investment income is recognised on a receivable basis

Income from charitable activities includes income received under contract or where entitlement to grant funding is subject to specific performance conditions is recognised as earned as the related services are provided. Grant income included in this category is recognised where there is entitlement, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability. Income is deferred when admission fees or performance related grants are received in advance of the event to which they relate.

Resources Expended Policy Notes

Expenditure is recognised when a liability is incurred. Contractual arrangements and performance related grants are recognised as goods and services are supplied. Other grant payments are recognised when a constructive obligation arises which results in the payment being unavoidable.

- · Costs of generating funds are those incurred in attracting voluntary income
- Charitable activities include expenditure associated with the staging of concerts, stage productions, exhibitions and educational programmes and include both the direct costs and support costs relating to these activities
- Governance costs include those incurred in the governance of the charity and its assets and are primarily associated with constitutional and statutory requirements
- Support costs include central functions and have been allocated to activity cost categories on a basis consistent with the use of the resources

Volunteers and Donated Services & Facilities

The value of services provided by volunteers is not incorporated into these financial statements. Further details of the contribution made by volunteers can be found in the trustees' annual report.

Where services are provided to Farnham Malting's as a donation that would normally be purchased from a third party, this contribution is recognised in the financial statements at an estimate based on the value of the contribution to the charity
