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NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the year ended 30 June 2018

1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Associated Electrical Distributors Limited is a private company, limited by guarantee, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on

the Company Information page.

The presentation currency of the financial statements is the Pound Sterling (£).

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of Section 1A "Small Entities" of Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

July 2015 amendments to FRS 102 section 1A have been applied before January 2016. There were no

transition adjustments as a result of preparing the accounts under FRS 102 section 1A for the first time.

Turnover

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, excluding discounts,

rebates, value added tax and other sales taxes.

The policies adopted for the recognition of turnover is as follows:-

Income from members

Income from members can be in the form of subscription income, member fines and ioining fees. This

is all invoiced and sales ledger invoices are recognised at the date of invoice.

Prepayments and accrued income, other debtors and deferred income are recognised as appropriate.

Catalogue income

The company recognises profits on each version of their catalogue when the issue is finished.

Conference income

The company collects donations from it's suppliers and members on an invoice basis for an annual

conference. This is shown in a separate account in the financial statements under reserves and any

conference expenditure is set against it.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Fixtures and fittings - 25% on reducing balance

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued Taxation

Taxation for the year comprises current and deferred tax. Tax is recognised in the Income Statement, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in

equity.

Current or deferred taxation assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Current tax is recognised at the amount of tax payable using the tax rates and laws that have been

enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

As the company falls under the category of a mutual trading body it's only taxed on it's external income.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at

the balance sheet date.

Timing differences arise from the inclusion of income and expenses in tax assessments in periods

different from those in which they are recognised in financial statements. Deferred tax is measured

using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the year end and that are

expected to apply to the reversal of the timing difference.

Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that it is probable

that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the

company's pension scheme are charged to profit or loss in the period to which they relate.

Investments

Investments are recognised initially at fair value which is normally the transaction price excluding

transaction costs. Subsequently, they are measured at fair value through profit or loss if the shares

are publicly traded or their fair value can otherwise be measured reliably. Other investments are

measured at cost less impairment.

Debtors and creditors receivable/payable within 1 year

Debtors and creditors with no stated interest rate and receivable or payable within one year are

recorded at transaction price. Any losses arising from impairment are recognised in the profit and loss

account in other administrative expenses.
