The C.S. Lewis Institute in Belfast is devoted to developing disciples who can articulate, defend, share and live faith in Christ in public and personal life; we are associated with the C.S. Lewis Institute in Washington D.C., which began in 1976 and stresses discipleship of heart and mind. The C.S. Lewis Institute works in partnership with local churches and ministries to help believers glorify God by becoming mature disciples of Jesus Christ who impact the spheres of influence to which God has called them. ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Significant activities

There are 3 main areas within the C.S. Lewis Institute in Belfast: 1. The C.S. Lewis Institute Fellows Program. An intensive 12 month mentoring/discipleship program that focuses on spiritual and theologicalgrowth and apologetics. In May 2019 the 3rd year of the Fellows Programme had 24 Fellows complete the Programme with 40 Fellows signed up to participate in the 4th year of the Fellows Programme, commencing in June 2019. Main activities of the Program included; Fellows Retreat in Murlough House in September 2018, monthly Saturday morning lectures, mentor meetings and small group gatherings October 2018 - June 2019, Urban Plunge event at the Hospice in Belfast to assist with their garden clear up in April 2019 and visit from C.S. Lewis Institute President Dr Joel Woodruff for Orientation of our 4th year Fellows in June 2019. 2. The C.S. Lewis Institute Inklings Program and Apologetics and Discipleship Seminars. Instruction and encouragement from various Christian authors and speakers to instruct and encourage participants about important aspects of life in the Kingdom of God - Inklings evenings in 2018/19 included: the Grace of God By Professor John Gillespie from the University of Ulster in November 2018, Justification & Sanctification with Dr Erik Thoennes from the Bible Institute of Los Angeles in January 2019, Spiritual Warfare with Dr Sam Hannon from Fellowship Bible Church NW Arkansas in February 2019 and Heaven & Hell with Dr Robert Cupp from Fellowship Bible Church NW Arkansas in June 2019. 3. Informal gatherings, where the important issues of the day and of personal life can be explored from the perspective of biblical orthodoxy. This year these included; a mentor's training day and day of prayer in August 2018, participation in the C.S. Lewis Festival and 75th Anniversary Dinner for Belfast Bible College in November 2018, Student Apologetics event at QUB Derryvolgy Halls and Mentor evening in January 2019 Christian Hospitality evening in February 2019, Public Lecture at Stranmillis College with Professor Jerry Root from Wheaton College Illinois on the Imagination of C.S. Lewis in March 2019 and a guided C.S. Lewis Tour of Belfast with Lewis expert Sandy Smith in May 2019.
